

The 1971 pin showing the Helen Keller Memorial in Tuscumbia, Alabama was attached to the card shown when traded by the Alabama Lions in 1971






1974 Medallion or keychain shown here with a key holder through the loop.




The blue bottom issue of the USS Alabama was traded by the Lions of Alabama at the International Convention. The District Governors of Alabama had the entire set to trade.



There is one with no trademark on the 1978 pin








