


**RHODE ISLAND** lis in the New England region of the U.S.A. and is the smallest state by area. NOTE: The Rhode Island pins in most pin traders collections are a combination of original issues and remakes. A PDG of Rhode Island was well known for his generosity in trying to make sure everyone who desired one was assured of getting one from him. To do this, he took it upon himself to have all of the pins from District 42 reproduced in sufficient quantity, without regard for whether the pin would be considered an original or a remake. Shortly before his passing, he even had complete sets (of the pins issued to that date) reproduced and sold at cost. It was NEVER his intent to deceive anyone about the authenticity of a particular pin. Great care was taken by this Lion to duplicate each issue as closely as possible to the original. In the process of reproduction, there were a number of variations created and we have shown as many of these as possible. It is hoped that with this knowledge, pin traders will better understand what happens when one takes it upon himself to reproduce and or to remake pins such as these. The low value that most pin traders have for Rhode Island pins is reflective of such actions. We want to emphasize that this note is in no way intended to be a criticism of a departed trader whom we had the highest regard for all the good that he otherwise did for pin trading in the early days. His election to the LITPC Hall of Fame before his demise certainly reflects the esteem that he was held by his peers. There are many, many variations. We have shown some here with remarks to give the serious collector an idea as to what is available. We have placed an asterisk beside the date of the pin to show that their are other variations of that pin. Most of the other variations are in the color of the emblem, the thickness of the paint and the color of the metal. Some emblems have no paint at all.






