


VERMONT is in the Northeast region of the U.S.A. and is part of an area called New England. With slightly more than 630,000 citizens, it is the second smallest State in the Union. It was admitted to the Union in 1791. The capital is Montpelier and the first Lions Club, Burlington, was chartered in 1924. Vermont has the distinction of being the leading producer of maplesyrup in the U.S.A.

Back of Pin

The original Vermont Script pin was made in 1963. It is very rare. The lettering is smaller and the back of the Lion and lettering is lined.





There are numerous copies of the remake available that were made without the VT on the back of the Lions head. It is otherwise identical to the remake. It is our understanding that these copies were not authorized.



The sitting Governors had the original pin remade in 2003. To insure that the pin was somewhat different from the original, they had the letters VT placed on the back of the Lions head. The lettering on the remake is larger and the back of the lettering is not lined.




